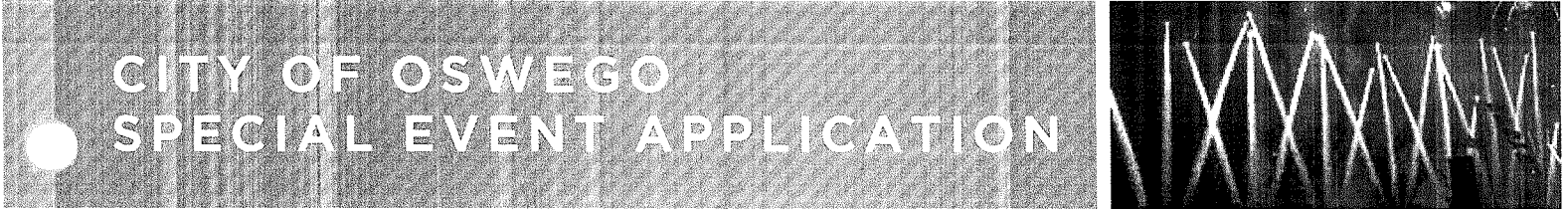

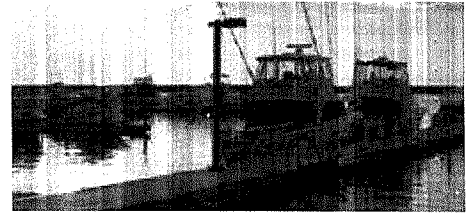

The City of Oswego's West Linear Riverwalk experienced flood damage from the 2017 FEMA Flood Disaster #37188. During the construction of the Riverwalk West project, a large void was discovered under the sidewalk immediately north of the switchback. Barton & Loguidice, D.P.C has submitted Amendment No. 1 for additional professional services to assess the sidewalk in this area and provide a solution to safely finish the original sidewalk reconstruction as described in the attached amendment in the amount of \$10,100.00.

We request that the Mayor be authorized to sign Amendment No. 1 with Barton & Loguidice , D.P.C to provide this additional service for the Riverwalk West - Bridge Street to West Utica Street Project to carry out the intent of this resolution.

Dear Mayor Barlow:

During the construction of the Riverwalk West project, a large void was discovered under the sidewalk immediately north of the switchback. Due to the unknown magnitude and prevalence of the void(s), construction in this section was stopped until the situation could be further assessed, and a design solution determined. As requested, we have prepared a proposal for engineering services to assess the sidewalk in this area and provide a solution to safely finish the original sidewalk reconstruction.

B&L proposes the following scope of services:

I. Data Collection

- a. B&L will hire GPRS to perform a GPR scan of the sidewalk to determine the extent and location of the voids.
- b. B&L will complete a supplementary field inspection to determine the size/magnitude of the voids. The GPR technology will determine the location of the voids, but cannot accurately predict depth. In the areas of the voids, B&L will work with WD Malone to core drill a hole in the sidewalk. B&L will utilize a camera to investigate the void and estimate the magnitude and other conditions of the void.

II. Repair Design

- a. Based on the findings of the GPR and supplementary field inspection under Phase I, B&L will formulate remedial scope of work for development of the final plans. It is anticipated that this will likely involve sealing the stone arches on the stream side of the wall and filling the void with grout.
- b. B&L will prepare a detail to address the void as well as modify the repair scheme being utilized on the sidewalk above for review.
- c. B&L will meet with the City and WD Malone to review their comments to incorporate into Final Plans.
- d. B&L will finalize the plans and submit them to sponsor for final review. Drawings will include the following:
 - Site Plan of Riverwalk to identify location of voids.
 - Cross section of Riverwalk to be repaired/replaced and void to be addressed.
- e. B&L will prepare a modification to the joint application package for NYSDEC/ACOE to account for the work occurring on the stream side of the wall.

Technical Assumptions

- The cost for WD Malone to core drill the sidewalk will be included under the construction contract in place with the City.
- Assume 2 people for 1 day to complete the field inspection
- It is not anticipated that the masonry wall will need to be rebuilt.

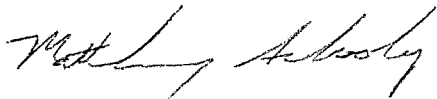

Mayor William J. Barlow, Jr. seeks favorable consideration from the Common Council in waiving a Right of Reversion contained in a Quitclaim Deed between the City of Oswego and the Oswego County Public Employees Federal Credit Union dated May 16, 2002.

The deed in question, which was recorded in the County Clerk's Office on June 13, 2002, granted land along East First Street on a part of the premises known as 190 East First Street to the Credit Union for purposes of developing a parking lot for a planned building. The City reserved a reversionary interest in the land if the Credit Union did not undertake the build out of the land. The build out never occurred and the City retains its interest in the land, which was formerly a portion of East Mohawk Street that was closed by the Common Council in 1924. A copy of the Quitclaim Deed is attached.

The property in question, 190 East First Street, is under contract to be purchased by a private developer who is asking the City to waive its reversion interest in the premises, including the reservation of 15 public parking spaces. The developer plans to construct a multi-million dollar health and wellness facility which will employ several people and add significantly to the tax base. The City of Oswego has no current or future plans to use the premises, nor exercise its right of reversion.

Mayor Barlow supports this action and believes it will be in the best interest of the City of Oswego to proceed as requested.

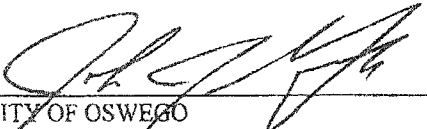
