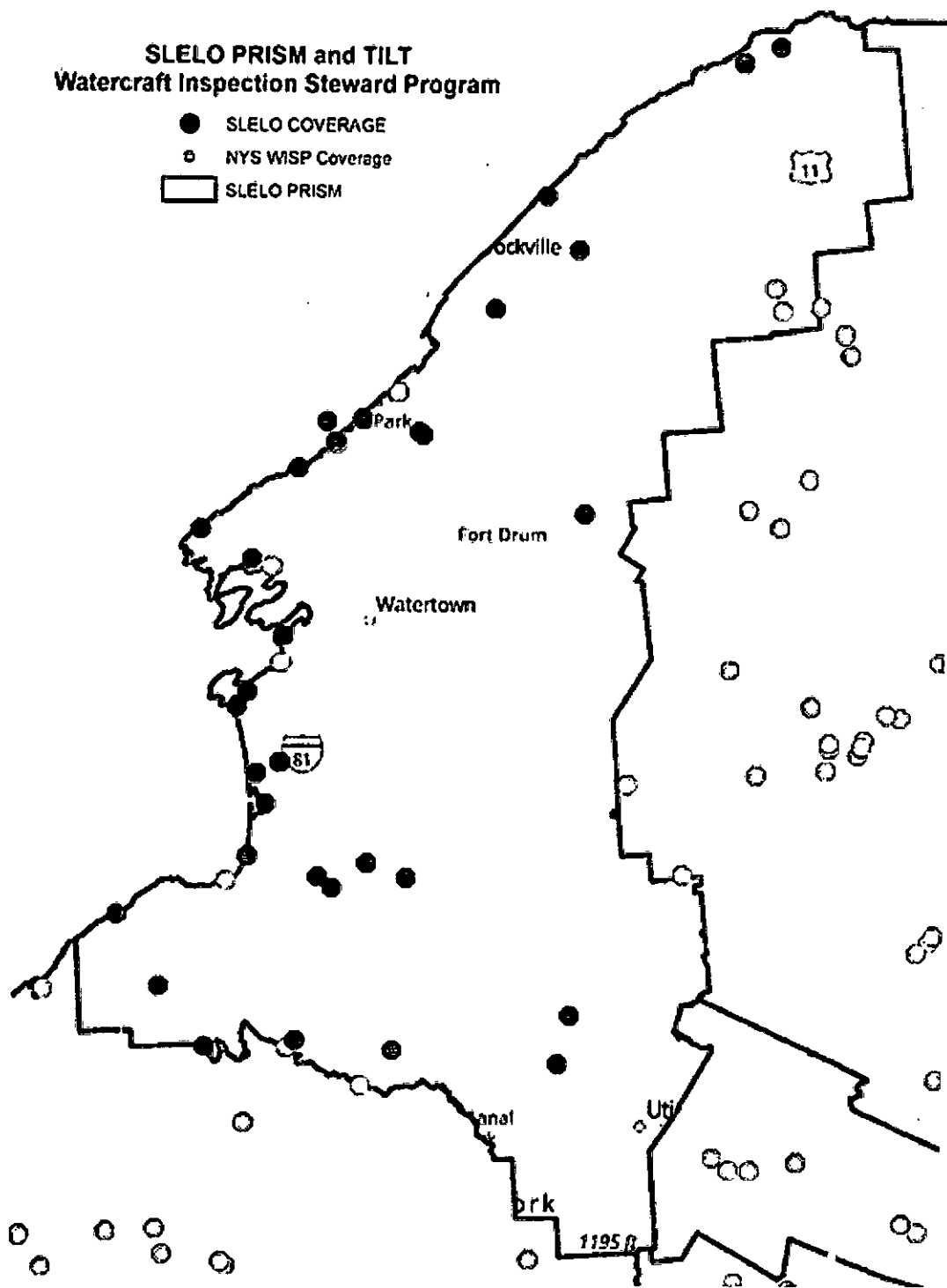

Hello,

As you may know, I am the Aquatic Restoration and Resiliency Coordinator with the St. Lawrence Eastern Lake Ontario Partnership for Regional Invasive Species Management (SLELO PRISM) and am again seeking your permission to have watercraft inspection stewards at your boat launch periodically throughout the summer. Days and times of duty at each site will change throughout the season which is anticipated to run May 15 – October 09, 2023. This effort is part of a statewide watercraft inspection steward program and one of the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation's Aquatic Nuisance Species priorities. Last year our stewards conducted over 12,000 surveys, spoke with 28,000 people and prevented 1,110 invasive species from being spread.

The inspection process would not impede launch access/exit. Boater participation in this initiative is 100% voluntary; these are not regulatory inspections. The goal of the program is for the stewards to teach boaters how to look for and remove aquatic invasive species from their boats and to empower boaters with information so they can inspect their watercraft in the absence of stewards. Invasive species such as hydrilla and northern snakehead are species that have been introduced into NY waterbodies and are having detrimental impacts on those waterways. Our stewards will be equipped with field supplies with them at the launch. These supplies may include a folding table, chair, umbrella, sandwich board, preserved specimens for educational purposes, and distribution materials. Stewards will bring and remove supplies each shift.

With boaters, the stewards will:

- walk through inspection checkpoints using a standardized protocol;
- engage boaters in dialogue about AIS, their impacts on the environment, and the importance of taking measures to prevent their spread;
- provide AIS educational materials; and
- collect boater usage and aquatic invasive species data.

Our program will be co-administered by the SLELO PRISM and the Thousand Islands Land Trust. As always, there is no cost to the municipality or site managers, we just need written permission from the appropriate committees in support of the program, this can be a formal letter or via email.

Please contact me by April 5, 2023, with your decision about allowing stewards to be stationed at your launch, or if you would like additional information. I look forward to working with you to minimize the spread of aquatic invasive species in New York's waters.

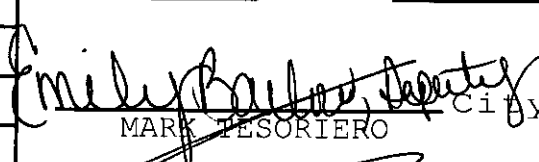

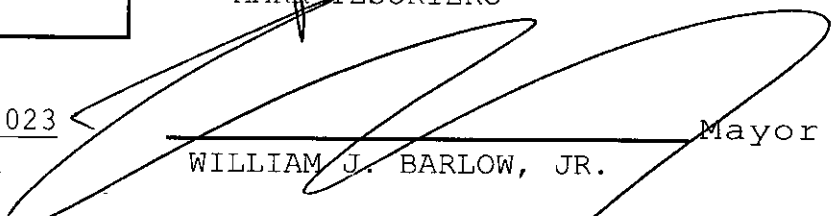

Chapter 83. Buildings, Dangerous

§ 83-1. Dangerous conditions enumerated.

All buildings or structures which have any or all of the following defects shall be deemed dangerous buildings:

- A. Those whose interior walls or other vertical structural members list, lean or buckle to such an extent that a plumb line passing through the center of gravity falls outside of the middle third of its base.
- B. Those which, exclusive of the foundations, show 33% or more of damage or deterioration of the supporting member or members or 50% of damage or deterioration of the nonsupporting enclosing or outside walls or covering.
- C. Those which have improperly distributed loads upon the floors or roofs or in which the same are overloaded or which have insufficient strength to be reasonably safe for the purpose used.
- D. Those which have been damaged by fire, wind or other causes so as to have become dangerous to life, safety, morals or the general health and welfare of the occupants or the people of the City of Oswego.
- E. Those which have become or are so dilapidated, decayed, unsafe or insanitary or which so utterly fail to provide the amenities essential to decent living that they are unfit for human habitation or are likely to cause sickness or disease so as to work injury to the health, morals, safety or general welfare of those living therein.
- F. Those buildings and structures, occupied or unoccupied, having light, air, water, electrical, hot water and sanitation facilities which are inadequate to protect the health, morals, safety or general welfare of human beings who live or may live therein.
- G. Those having inadequate facilities for egress in case of fire or panic or those having insufficient stairways, fire escapes or other means of communication.
- H. Those which have parts thereof which are so attached that they may fall and injure members of the public or property.
- I. Those which, because of their condition, are unsafe, insanitary or dangerous to the health, morals, safety or general welfare of the people of this City.
- J. Those buildings existing in violation of any provision of the Building Code of this City or any provisions of any ordinances relating to the prevention of fire or of other ordinances of this City or laws of the State of New York now or hereafter adopted.

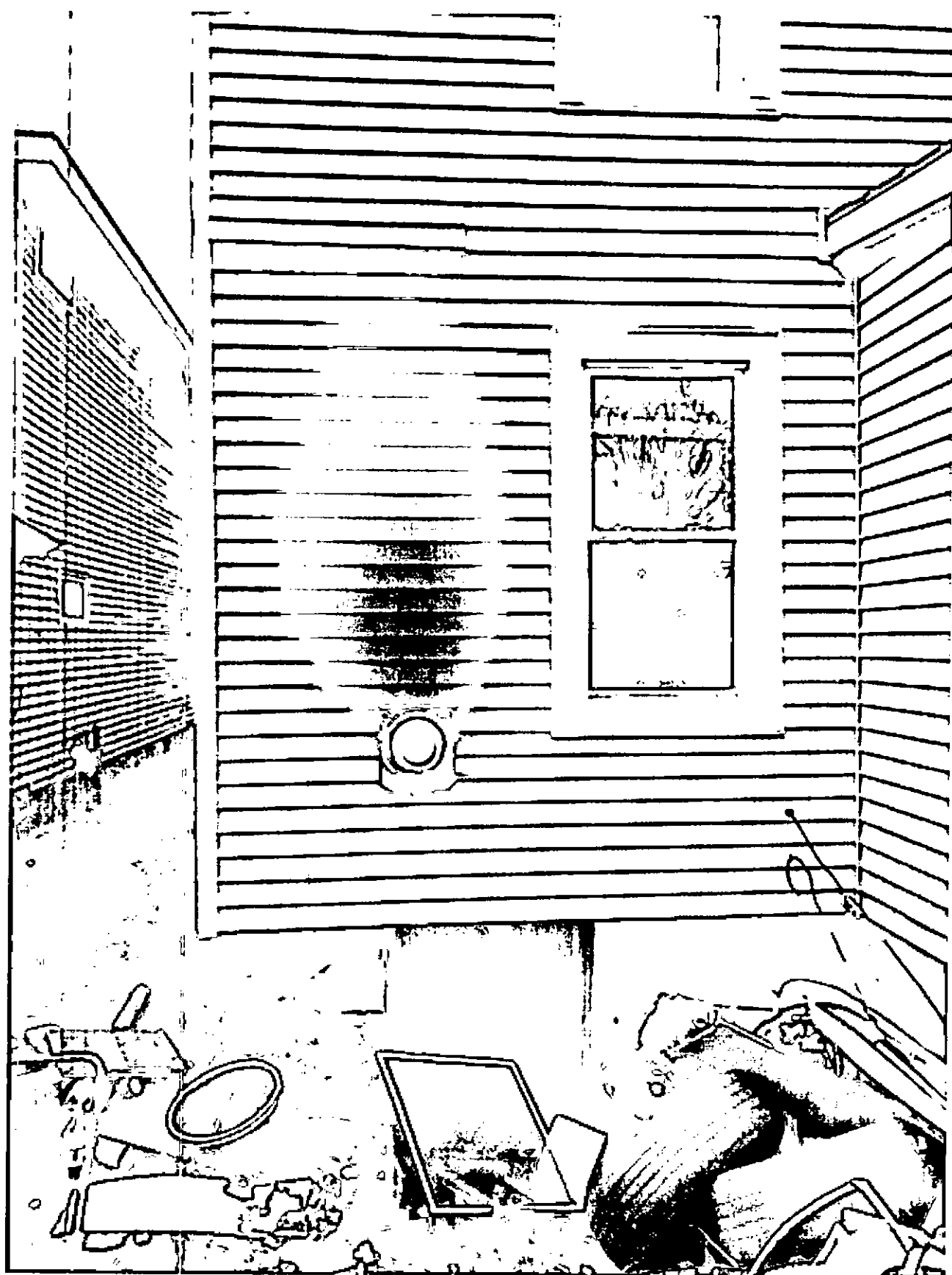
§ 83-3. Dangerous buildings deemed nuisances.

All dangerous buildings within the terms of § 83-1 of this chapter are hereby declared to be public nuisances and shall be repaired, vacated or demolished as hereinbefore and hereafter provided.

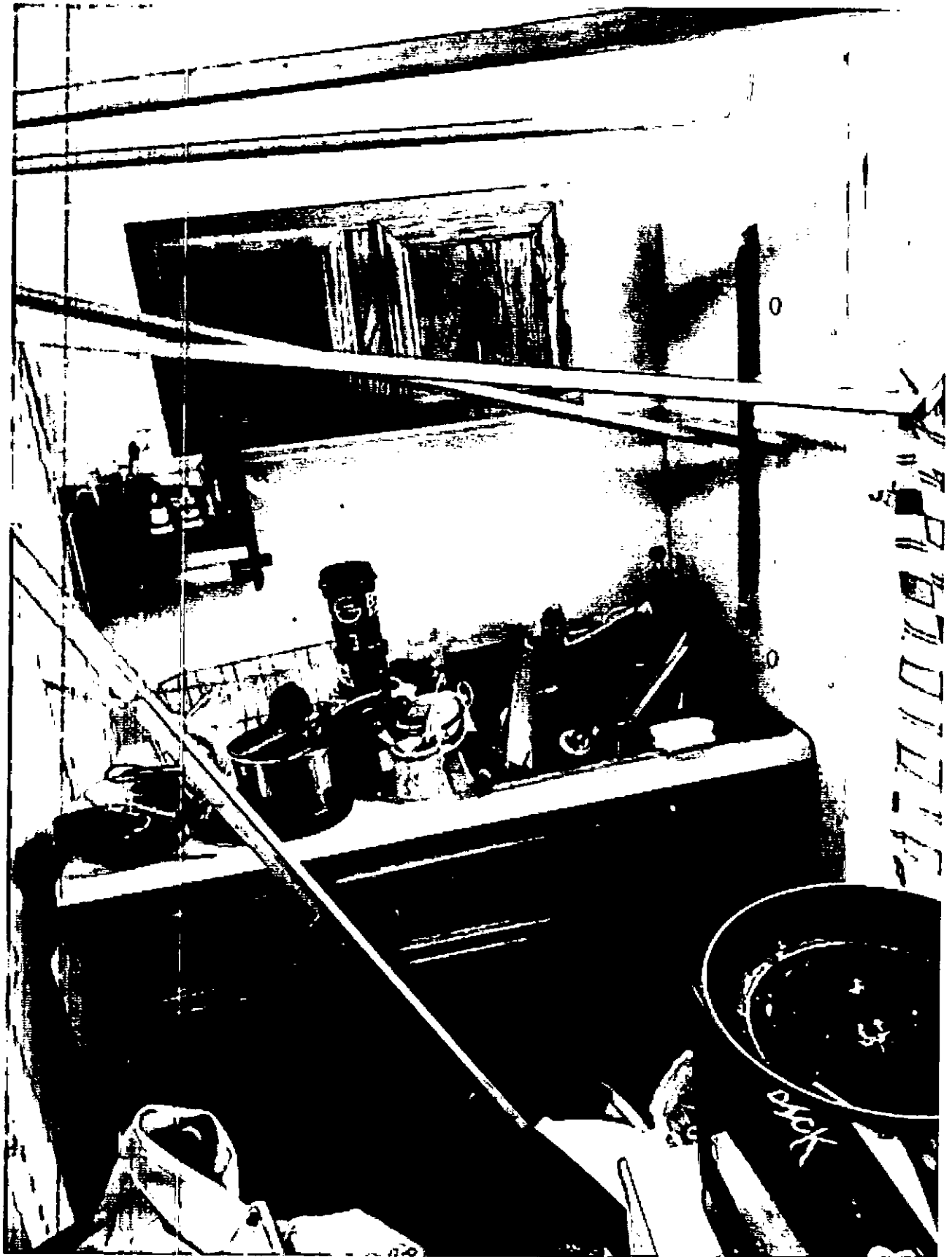
§ 83-6. Emergency cases.

In cases where it reasonably appears that there is immediate danger to the life or safety of any person unless a dangerous building as defined herein is immediately repaired, vacated or demolished, the Building Inspector shall report such facts to the Common Council, and the Common Council may direct the Director of Code Enforcement to cause the immediate repair, vacation or demolition of such dangerous building. The costs of such emergency repair, vacation or demolition of such dangerous building shall be collected in the same manner as provided in § 83-5E hereof.





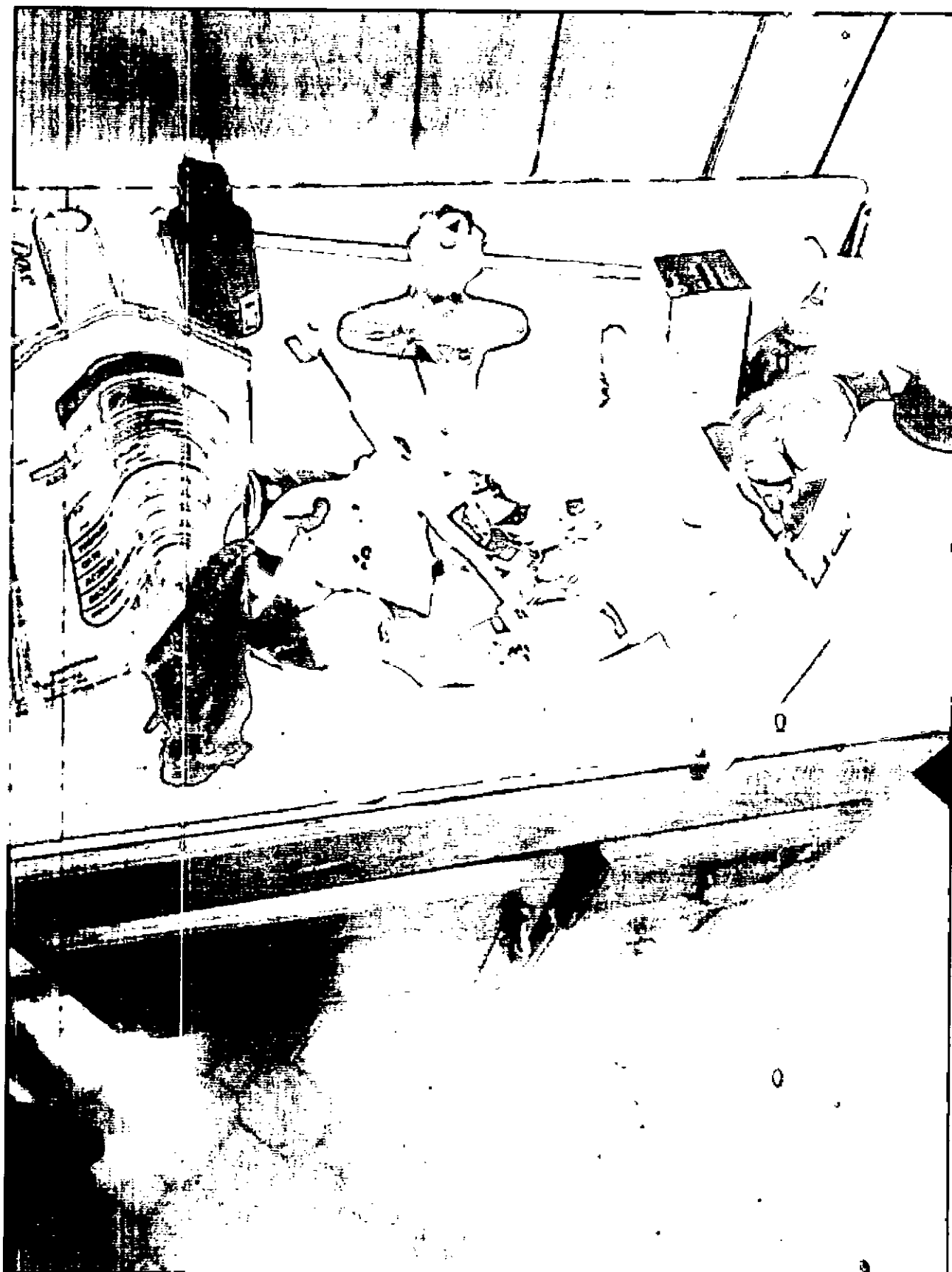


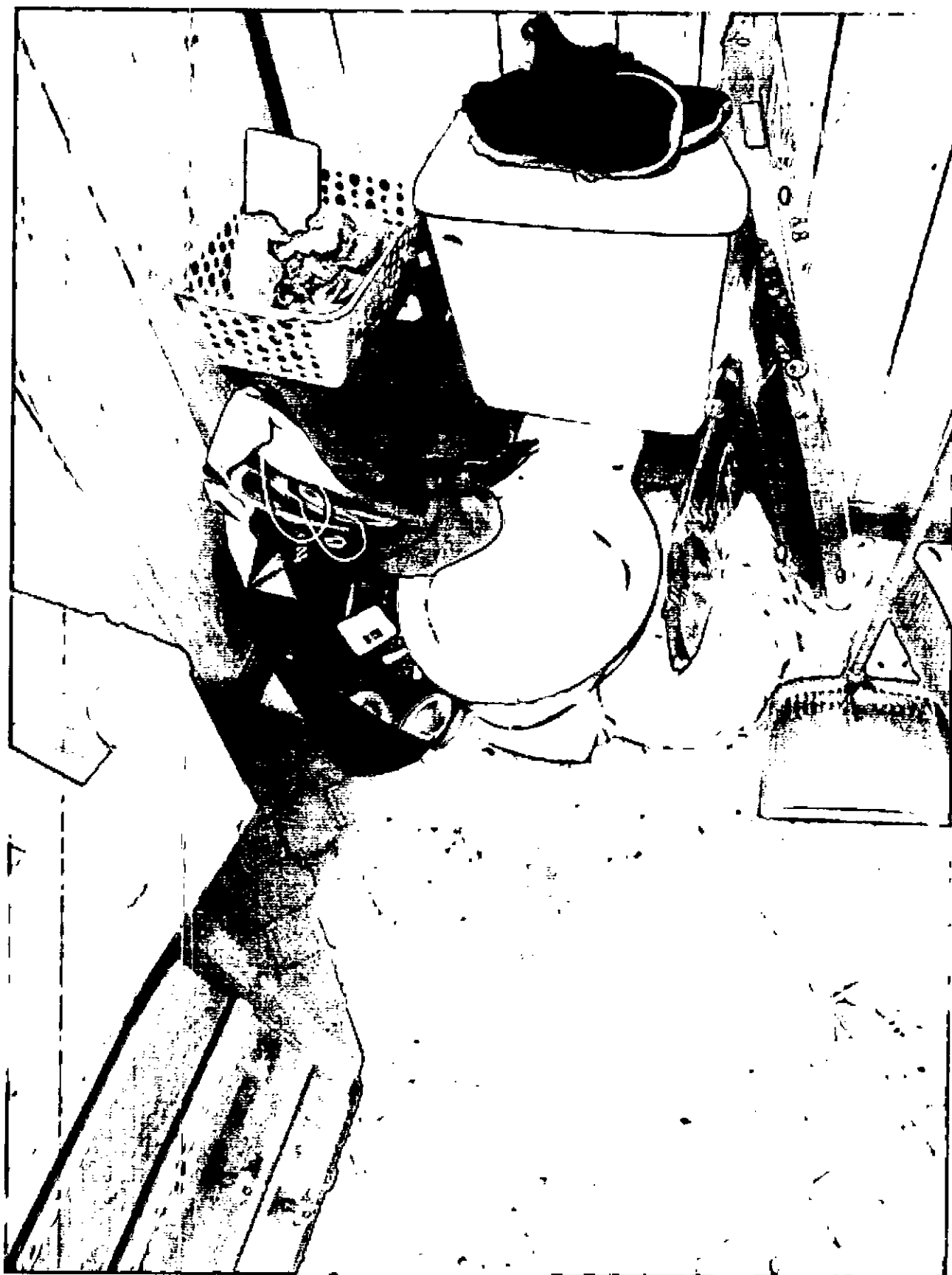

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2023, the Code Enforcement Office for the City of Oswego was called to inspect the dwelling by the Oswego Police Department who was investigating alleged criminal activity involving current occupants of the dwelling; and

WHEREAS, it is believed that the occupants of the dwelling include two adults and two children, ages four (4) and two (2); and

WHEREAS, upon entering the dwelling the Code Enforcement Office immediately noted multiple dangerous conditions, as defined in Chapter 83 of the City Code, to include literally each and every dangerous condition enumerated in Section 83-1 (attached to and made part of this resolution); and

WHEREAS, the Code Enforcement Office documented the dangerous conditions that exist inside and outside the dwelling with a series of photographs (incorporated by reference and made part of this resolution); and

WHEREAS, having considered the information provided by the Code Enforcement Office, and acknowledging that dangerous buildings are public nuisances requiring repair, vacation, or demolition, the Common Council declares it to be in the best interest of the residents of the City of Oswego to take immediate action and declare the dwelling a dangerous building within the meaning of Chapter 83 of the City Code and direct the Code Enforcement Office to cause the immediate repair, vacation or demolition of the dwelling as provided for in Section 83-6 of the City Code; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that 15 East Seventh Street, also known as Tax Parcel #: 128.40-03-42, is a dangerous building as provided for in Chapter 83 of the Code of the City of Oswego; and it is further

RESOLVED, that 15 East Seventh Street is hereby declared a public nuisance in accordance with Section 83-3, and shall be repaired, vacated, or demolished as best determined by the Director of Code Enforcement; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Director of Code Enforcement is hereby authorized and directed to cause the immediate repair, vacation, or demolition of 15 East Seventh Street consistent with the provisions contained in Chapter 83 of the City Code, and all other applicable provisions of the City Code, as well as relevant State laws, rules, and regulations; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the costs of such emergency repair, vacation, or demolition shall be collected in the same manner as provided in Section 83-5(E) of the City Code; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Director of Code Enforcement is hereby authorized to take all other and further action necessary to immediately secure the dwelling to prevent occupancy by anyone, including the owner of the dwelling, and to draw upon the other departments of the City of Oswego to assist in securing the dwelling against occupancy until a final disposition of the dwelling is determined.
